ACADEMICS

9/10/2020 Meeting

1. Receive a report from the Strategic Planning Committee on rolling out the critical thinking initiative, using the rubric establish a base line (use Fall testing compared to Fall of this year Spring testing was not available due to COVID)
2. Receive 2 reports – one in November on effects of COVID on testing results. Include how we plan to address the results and follow up at the end of the year on progress made.
3. Report on progress of 4Cs initiative, the plan for moving to the next “C”.
4. Receive a report from the FDR Administration on the elements that contribute to maintaining or increasing the 4-year cohort graduation rate (as expressed by the NYS School Report Card) and update on that rate as compared to the last few years.

BOARD / ADMINISTRATIVE OPERATIONS

1. Conduct a Board Retreat in November to understand the fiscal impact of possible scenarios we may experience due to financial implications during the COVID pandemic.
2. BOE members will attend at least one Professional Development training (webinar or other training) this school year.

“NEW” DIVERSITY & EQUITY

9/10/2020

1. Make the District’s progress in diversity and Equity, visible and public.
2. Receive 2 reports, one mid year and one at the end of the year, on the District Comprehensive Improvement Plan (DCIP) including structures and policies on inclusion and diversity in classrooms and across the board.

BUDGET & ADMINISTRATION

1. Support a budget that maintains as many programs as possible given the tax cap.
2. Verify that any spending reductions are distributed with equity.
3. Ensure spending is based on actual spending and not previous years’ budgeting.
4. Receive monthly updates on financial status re: COVID Pandemic expenditures/ revenues.

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COMMUNITY

10/8/2020

1. Each Board Member will attend a community event (either district or greater community based) in an effort to increase their availability at settings other than board meetings, and will report on those interactions during PRIDE, as appropriate.
2. Administration to present ideas on how to quantify community involvement, give year to year comparisons, with the goal of measuring how the district is doing in developing events that increase community participation.

TECHNOLOGY

1. Receive a presentation giving examples of how technology supports or is being integrated into the 4 C's Initiative. Include how we are meeting the needs of students and staff.
2. Report on Smart Bond fund status and financial status of Technology budget (include additional costs due to pandemic).
